



Call for Editor(s): International Migration journal

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) invites applications for the editorship of *International Migration*.

This is a refereed, scientific journal on migration issues as analyzed by demographers, geographers, economists, sociologists, political scientists and other social scientists from around the world. **It covers all policy-relevant aspects of international migration**, giving attention not only to a breadth of topics but also ensuring coverage of all geographies. Issues cover the full spectrum of human mobility and all stages of the migration cycle, from origin, transit, destination, and return and reintegration are relevant to the journal.

International Migration publishes one volume of six issues per year. The journal publishes papers based on original research, critical policy debates and comparative analyses. Geographic diversity and contributions based on multi-disciplinary research are priorities of the journal.

We are seeking expressions of interest for an editorial team consisting of at least two and a maximum of four editors. We encourage applications from individuals from a diverse range of backgrounds, institution types, geographical regions, and under-represented groups. Assessment criteria will consist, among others, of disciplinary, geographic and thematic expertise.

The editorial team is responsible for commissioning content (articles or special issues), accepting and rejecting manuscripts based on the quality of the research presented and the suitability of the subject matter, guiding manuscripts through the peer review process; overseeing revisions, planning issues and reviewing special issue proposals. Following the recruitment of the editorial team, a new editorial board will be constituted jointly with IOM Research.

Applicants should have broad expertise in migration studies and multidisciplinary overview. Previous experience in editing journals or having been involved in the editorial board of a journal will be considered an asset. Applicants need to demonstrate sound institutional backing to successfully carry out their duties as an Editor. The editorial team should expect to serve a three-year term, with the option to extend it for another term depending on interest, performance and following the completion of a due process.

An annual honorarium will be offered.

Letters of interest and evidence of institutional backing, along with the curriculum vitae of the applying editor(s) should be clearly marked as '**Application for Editors – International Migration Journal**' and submitted to Dr Pablo Rojas Coppari, Research Unit Head at research@iom.int.

The deadline for applications is September 6th, 2026.

Late applications will not be considered. All applications will be treated confidentially. We welcome queries about the journal, the role, from potential applicants, and thank you for your interest in *International Migration*.
